

The Woodland Kitchen

The current Woodland Kitchen is a temporary structure that originated 14 years ago as a rudimentary shelter located at the south end of Gables Farm. Over time it has developed into an invaluable facility that operates as a busy meeting place, learning space and catering facility for students and staff that are based at Gables Farm.

The Woodland Kitchen currently offers very little seating, has limited cooking facilities, a student built earth oven and tarpaulin roof. In its current state it is not weather proof and conditions are very cramped. It is in urgent need of replacement

The new Woodland Kitchen will be larger than the current structure, offer heating and have the facilities of a commercial kitchen. It will be able to cater and provide seating for more students as well as being an improved teaching space. The building will consist of a timber 'snail shell' framework and turf roof, it has been designed to be in keeping with the natural environment and incorporates sustainable materials. Students will be involved in key stages of the build. Like our recent green wood workshop re-build, we hope community volunteers will be involved in the project.
